(The storm water project timeline may impact having the garden tour....).

The storm water project.

Cedar and Nancy gave a great overview of the latest understanding of the storm water project that is planned for Boston Harbor Road. The initial plan was extensive and involved many established yards and gardens along the roadway. The plan is being revised. The County has recognized that it may not be necessary to make all storm drains consistent which will result in far less disruption to the ditches and vegetation along the roadway. The focus will be to address flooding issues.

The in-water part of the work project has timing limits; work such as this is done between July 15 and October 15, and when there are not surf smelt spawning. However, if an approved biologist determines that there are not surf smelt present, work can occur, but must be completed with two weeks.

The upland part of the project can occur with no timing restriction, except the goal of avoiding muddy runoff into the harbor.

At the February Boston Harbor Neighborhood Association meeting the county hopes to present the revised plan.

A further issue is the new street lighting that has been placed by PSE along 72nd Way and 72nd Ave. Nancy will talk to Richard from the association and Patty will talk to PSE regarding the lighting situation. The concern is over lighting and impact on the night sky.

Boat Launch Rebuild. This is slated for summer 2022, but no details were presented at this time.
