# IvyBeGone TEAM SWITCHES GEARS TO WATERING FLEDGLING NATIVE PLANTS AT BURFOOT

After a long travail of getting access to water that we won't bore you with, we figured out a way to water the plants using two "secret" spigots, 250 feet of hose, myriad buckets and volunteers—a twist on the old "Bucket Brigade". We will continue to do this through the summer.

### SAVING OUR SEWER SCREEN UPDATE

**Check out county government in action August 20, 2 pm.** At the Board of Commissioners (BoCC) weekly meeting on August 20, they will vote on whether to approve acquisition of the parcel next to our wastewater treatment plant (see May and June newsletters for background). We advocated for this and they listened! The BoCC meetings are public so you can attend and just observe, or you can say a few words. It's kind of cool to see government in action. Kim Kelley, our Environment Committee chair will attend and probably say a few words to thank Public Works and the commissioners. No telling what she'll do if they approve the acquisition. Join her! ## PROPOSAL FOR BURFOOT PARK EXPANSION HEADED TO COMMISSIONERS

In the June 2024 BHA newsletter, we asked for your input on a proposal for what to do with the 16 acres the county owns in Boston Harbor. Put simply, we're proposing the county retain 8 of the 16 acres to expand Burfoot Park in the future, leaving the other 8 acres subject to county review and potential sale if they determine there's no public need for it. We received comments from 35 households. The comments were very supportive of the proposal. Two were neutral, one with comments about the rights of way, and the other with concerns about privacy for homeowners adjacent to what could be park someday. You can see all the comments received on the BHA website under <u>Documents</u>. Our next step is to submit the proposal and comments to the county commissioners and Public Works leadership.
